In addition, she should be able to provide professional expertise, high quality learning and teaching, make effective use of resources, and ensure improved standards of learning and achievement for all students.

- A degree in Arts and a School teaching qualification; or any equivalent certificate / Degree School Education.
- Good command of English language is recommended.
